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DEFINING A PROGRAMME

EXAMPLES OF MODULES OR INTERACTION FORMATS

Building understanding - Plenary (with moderator) or group discussions exploring the definitions and impact of water integrity

Exploring the international context - Plenary (with moderator) or group discussions giving an overview of international processes related to water integrity to put the topic in a wider perspective.

Tool marketplace - Open presentations by participants on tools and their applications (for example with posters and brief pitches) to other participants.
Optional: participants could “vote” for tools which they want to learn more about in breakout groups.

Tool break-out groups - Small group discussions exploring the applicability of various tools in projects and programmes. Results could be presented in plenary setting with poster presentations.
Optional: participants can be divided in break-out groups based on their votes in the tools market place.

Open space - Free / open slot for participants to organize their own session on a theme / tool / programme of their choice. Participants should be informed about this beforehand so they can prepare.
Optional: participants could pitch their session in plenary setting to convince other participants to join their sessions.

Action planning roundtables – Small group discussions to jointly formulate action plans for mainstreaming water integrity in programmes or specific processes, based on an action plan framework developed beforehand (see resource 6).

Defining next steps – Plenary (with moderator) to discuss actions that can be undertaken to follow-up on the workshop
